Axiomatic Theory of Economics was completed in 1993, though it didn't get published until 1999. In 1993 I showed the manuscript to Dr. Rothbard at UNLV and reminded him of his lamentations for "old-fashioned treatises on economic principles." (*Man, Economy and State*, page vii) I was rebuked for being a mathematician. However, Dr. Rothbard is dead now and Austrian Economics didn't die with him. From what you told me on the phone, there is a new generation. I'd like to see one of them review my book.

If you do decide to review *Axiomatic Theory of Economics*, you might also consider printing the enclosed *Simplified Exposition* in the same issue of your journal. It is a reprint of the introduction with some additions, like a glossary to make it more accessible to the general reader, and is designed to introduce my work to people with only one semester of calculus. Nova Science gave me permission to distribute it independently.
